PROCLAMATION OF A STATE OF EMERGENCY

GOVERNOR BROWN DIRECTS ASSISTANCE FOR MONO COUNTY WILDFIRE

2-26-2015

A PROCLAMATION OF A STATE OF EMERGENCY

WHEREAS a fire started on February 6, 2015, in Mono County; and
WHEREAS the fire burned thousands of acres, destroying over 40 structures, including residences, necessitating the evacuation of residents and the opening of emergency shelters; and

WHEREAS the fire created a substantial amount of hazardous debris over a large area, affecting the community of Small Meadows; and

WHEREAS this debris is threatening public health and safety and the environment, and it must be removed and disposed of quickly and properly to ensure that the area can be reoccupied safely; and

WHEREAS on February 6, 2015, Mono County proclaimed a local emergency declaring that conditions of extreme peril to the safety of persons and property exists, and on February 11, 2015, the Mono County Health Officer declared a local health emergency due to hazardous debris from this fire; and

WHEREAS the circumstances of this fire, by reason of their magnitude, are or are likely to be beyond the control of the services, personnel, equipment and facilities of any single local government and require the combined forces of a mutual aid region or regions to combat; and

WHEREAS under the provisions of sections 8567 and 8571 of the Government Code, I find that strict compliance with the various statutes and regulations specified in this Proclamation would prevent, hinder, or delay the mitigation of the effects of the fire; and

WHEREAS under the provisions of section 8558(b) of the California Government Code, I find that conditions of extreme peril to the safety of persons and property exists within Mono County due to this fire.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, EDMUND G. BROWN JR., Governor of the State of California, in accordance with the authority vested in me by the State Constitution and statutes, including the California Emergency Services Act, and in particular, section 8625 of the California Government Code, HEREBY PROCLAIM A STATE OF EMERGENCY to exist within Mono County.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT:

1. All agencies of the state government utilize and employ state personnel, equipment, and facilities for the performance of any and all activities related to this state of emergency consistent with the direction of the Office of Emergency Services and the State Emergency Plan.
2. The Office of Emergency Services shall provide local government assistance, as appropriate, under the authority of the California Disaster Assistance Act, California Government Code section 8680 et seq. and California Code of Regulations, Title 19, section 2900 et seq.
3. State statutes, rules, regulations, and requirements are hereby suspended to the extent they apply to the following activities: (a) removal, storage, transportation, and disposal of hazardous and non-hazardous solid waste and debris resulting from the fire that has burned in Mono County and that are subject to the jurisdiction of agencies within the California Environmental Protection Agency and the California Natural Resources Agency; and (b) necessary restoration and rehabilitation of timberland, streams, rivers, and other waterways. Such statutes, rules, regulations, and requirements are hereby suspended only to the extent necessary for expediting the removal and cleanup of debris from the fire and for implementing any restoration plan by Mono County. Individuals who desire to conduct activities under this suspension of statutes, rules, regulations, and

requirements shall first request that the appropriate Agency Secretary, or that Agency Secretary's delegate, make a determination that the proposed activities are eligible to be conducted under this suspension.

4. The Secretary for the California Environmental Protection Agency and the Secretary for the California Natural Resources Agency shall use sound discretion in applying this order to ensure that the suspension serves the purpose of accelerating cleanup and recovery, while at the same time protecting public health and the environment. This order shall apply to, but is not necessarily limited to: solid waste facility permits, waste discharge requirements for storage and disposal; emergency timber harvesting; emergency construction activities; and waste discharge requirements and/or Water Quality Certification for discharges of fill material or pollutants. To the extent it is within their administrative authority, the boards, departments, and offices within the California Environmental Protection Agency and the California Natural Resources Agency shall expedite the granting of other authorizations, waivers, or permits necessary for the removal, storage, transportation, and disposal of hazardous and non-hazardous debris resulting from the fire and for other actions necessary for the protection of public health and the environment.

5. As necessary to assist local governments and for the protection of public health and the environment, state agencies shall enter into contracts to arrange for the procurement of materials, goods, and services necessary to quickly remove dangerous debris and repair damaged resources. Because strict compliance with the provisions of the Government Code and the Public Contract Code applicable to state contracts would prevent, hinder, or delay these efforts, applicable provisions of those statutes, including but not limited to travel, advertising, and competitive bidding requirements are suspended to the extent necessary to address the effects of the fire.

6. State agencies and departments within my administration shall work with local officials to assist them in establishing and implementing a comprehensive debris removal plan.

This Proclamation is not intended to, and does not, create any rights or benefits, substantive or procedural, enforceable at law or in equity, against the State of California, its agencies, departments, entities, officers, employees, or any other person.

I FURTHER DIRECT that as soon as hereafter possible, this Proclamation be filed in the Office of the Secretary of State and that widespread publicity and notice be given of this Proclamation.

RIGHT-OF-ENTRY PERMIT



RIGHT OF ENTRY PERMIT

[For debris removal on private property]

I, _____ (Owner), hereby permit the County of Mono, its officers, employees, agents, contractors and subcontractors (County), to enter the Owner's property located at _____ (Property), subject to all licenses, easements, encumbrances, and claims of title affecting the Property upon the following terms and conditions:

1. **Grant of Right-of-Entry.** Owner hereby grants the County the right to enter the Property for the purpose of inspecting, testing materials, or removing any wildfire-generated debris of whatever nature including but not limited to ash, vehicles, trailers, miscellaneous debris, trees identified by an arborist as hazardous, waste or other materials from the Property, subject to the terms and conditions set forth in this Right-of-Entry Permit (Permit). It is fully understood that this Permit does not create any obligation on the County to perform inspection, testing, or remove debris. Owner understands that the County will undertake no cleanup action until this Permit is signed.
2. **Private Insurance Coverage.** Most homeowner insurance policies have coverage to pay for the costs of removal of wildfire-generated debris. Owner understands that in the event state financial assistance is received by the Owner for purposes of inspection, testing or removing debris hereunder, state law (Title 19, Division 2. California Governor's Office of Emergency Services, Chapter 6. Disaster Assistance Act) requires the Owner to reimburse the County for the cost of removing wildfire-generated debris to the extent covered in the Owner's insurance policy. Owner also understands that, when requested, Owner must provide a copy of the insurance policy, proof/statement of loss and settlement agreement from Owner's insurance company to the County.

Owner (____ does, ____ does not) have homeowners or other similar insurance. If Owner indicates that Owner does not have such insurance, Owner certifies under penalty of perjury that there was no insurance in effect at the time of the wildfire which may provide coverage for the costs of inspection, testing or removing debris.

3. **Duplication of Benefits.** Owner (____ has, ____ has not) and (____ will, ____ will not) receive(d) any compensation for debris removal from any other source including Small Business Administration individual and family grant program or any other public assistance program. Owner will advise County in writing within 10 days of receipt of any insurance settlement for debris removal. Owner further agrees to reimburse the County within 10 days of receipt of any insurance from such insurance proceeds for the cost of the debris removal conducted by the County. In the event the insurance proceeds are less than the cost of debris removal incurred by the County, the Owner will not be responsible for the difference. If the insurance proceeds exceed the County's costs of debris removal, Owner will keep any excess proceeds. Owner understand that all disaster related funding, including that for debris removal from private property, is subject to audit.

4. **Hold Harmless.** County shall not be liable for, and Owner shall indemnify and hold harmless the County, State of California, California Governor's Office of Emergency Services (CalOES), California Environmental Protection Agency (CalEPA), California Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery (CalRecycle) and any of their officers, agencies, agents, contractors, subcontractors, employees and volunteers, against any and all claims, deductibles, self-insured retentions, demands liability, judgments, awards, fines, mechanics' liens or other liens, labor disputes, losses, damages, expenses, personal injury, charges or costs of any kind or character, including attorneys' fees and court costs (hereinafter collectively referred to as "Claims"), which arise out of or are in any way connected to actions arising out of this Permit, and hereby release, discharge and waive any claims and actions , in law or equity, arising therefrom.

Owner shall make Owner's best efforts to mark any sewer lines, utilities (electricity, gas, cable, etc.), septic tanks, and water lines located on the Property.

5. **No County Assumption of Liability for Remediation.** In consideration of the assistance the County is providing to the Owner under this Permit at no cost to the Owner, the County assumes no liability or responsibility, and the Owner shall not seek to recover from the County, CalOES, CalEPA, CalRecycle, or any of their officers, agencies, agents, contractors, subcontractors, employees and volunteers, the costs of any remediation of damages to the Property incurred due to action taken pursuant to this Permit.
6. **County Agents.** Any person, firm, or corporation authorized to work on the Property by the County shall be deemed to be a County agent, including but not limited to employees, agents, or representatives of the State of California, CalOES, CalEPA, and CalRecycle, and shall be subject to all applicable terms hereof.
7. **Authority.**
 - a. **Owner is natural person or persons:** Owner represents and warrants that it has full power and authority to execute and perform its obligations under this Permit and that fee title to the Property vests solely in the person or persons described above as Owner.
 - b. **Owner not a natural person:** If the Owner is not a natural person (e.g., if Owner is a corporation, trust, etc.), then this Permit must be executed by a duly authorized agent of Owner having the full power and authority pursuant to Owner's governing documents to execute this Permit on behalf of the Owner, to bind Owner, and to perform Owner's obligations hereunder, without the need for any further action. The person(s) executing this Permit on behalf of the Owner certify that they are the duly designated agents of the Owner as described above, and that fee title to the Property vests solely in Owner.
8. **Entire Agreement.** This Permit constitutes the entire agreement between the parties with respect to the subject matter hereof, and all prior or contemporaneous agreements, understandings and representations, oral or written, are superseded.
9. **Modification.** The provisions of this Permit may not be modified except by a written instrument signed by both parties.

10. **Partial Invalidity.** If any provisions of this Permit is determined by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or unenforceable, the remainder of this Permit shall not be affected thereby if this Permit's primary purpose(s) can be carried out. Each provision hereof shall be valid and enforceable to the fullest extent permitted by law.
11. **Successors and Assigns.** This Permit shall bind and benefit the parties and their successors and assigns, except as may otherwise be provided herein.

7. LEA Conditions:

- A. The operator shall comply with State Minimum Standards for solid waste handling and disposal as specified in Title 14 and Title 27, California Code of Regulation (CCR). The operator shall not operate this facility without possession of all required permits/regulatory approvals. The operator shall inspect the site at a frequency sufficient to ensure compliance with all applicable standards/condition/mitigation/regulation as are applicable to this facility.
- B. The operator shall comply with all applicable federal, state and local requirements and enactments including all mitigation and monitoring measures and all administrative/enforcement orders of all regulatory agencies with jurisdiction at this facility.
- C. The operator shall maintain a complete copy of this SWFP on the premises. Copies of all LEA/CIWMB regulatory inspection reports and enforcement actions shall be maintained at the main Integrated Waste Management Office. Such reports to be readily available to facility personnel, LEA staff and other appropriate regulatory personnel.
- D. Additional information concerning the design/operation of the facility shall be furnished upon request to the LEA and other regulatory personnel.
- E. The operator shall notify the LEA in writing of any proposed change in the routine facility operation or changes in facility design during the planning stages. In no case shall the operator undertake any significant changes unless the operator first submits to the LEA a notice of said changes at least 150 days before said changes are undertaken. Any significant changes as determined by the LEA would require a permit revision.
- F. The LEA reserves the right to suspend and/or modify permit conditions at this facility when deemed necessary due to any emergency, potential health hazard, and/or public nuisance.
- G. The terms and conditions of this permit may change as a result of revision of applicable statutes or regulations.
- H. This permit does not release the operator from its responsibility under any other existing laws, ordinances, regulations, or statutes of other government agencies.
- I. A log of special occurrences shall be maintained. The log shall contain but not be limited to: fire, explosion, discharges, significant incidents of personnel injury, accidents, weather events, unusual and sudden settlement, discharge of hazardous or other wastes not permitted, and/or property damage. The log shall be maintained on the premises. Days without incidents shall be noted in the log with an appropriate negative entry.
- J. The load checking program and the gas monitoring program shall be carried out as approved by the LEA at least quarterly. Both plans shall be incorporated to the most current and approved RDSI.
- K. The operator shall provide adequate on-site and off-site litter control to collect accumulated materials, if any.
- L. The operator shall compile daily tonnage received and make available to the LEA quarterly.
- M. All tires shall be accepted, sorted, stored, and disposed of according to Title 14.
- N. Storage of green material feedstock and mulch/chips must be done in accordance with Title 14 section 17862.1 and 17862.2.
- O. Alternative daily cover can be used as approved in the current RDSI.
- P. Windrows/Berms, if used for delineation and construction of cells at the active face, will contain only inert materials. Any organic components or garbage lodged into these berms will require that the berms receive daily cover.
- Q. The land farm for petroleum contaminated soils shall be operated according to the tiered permitting requirements for notification in Title 14, the most current Waste Discharge Requirements, and the most current environmental review document.
- R. Drainage plans accepted and approved by the RWQCB shall be adhered to and incorporated in to the most current and approved RDSI.
- S. Dead animals shall be completely covered as soon as possible and at a minimum at the end of the working day with 6 inches of soil. Compaction follows after decomposition.
- T. Ashes from household wood stoves or incinerators, and burn barrels shall be deposited away from the working face and completely covered by the end of the working day with 6 inches of compacted soil as required in regulations.
- U. Used motor oil (removed within 90 days), oil filters (no more than 1 ton at any one time), antifreeze (removed within 90 days), and batteries (no more than 1 ton at any one time) shall be accepted, stored, transported, and recycled according to Title 22 regulations. Employees handling these materials shall be provided all Title 22 training. Documentation of removal (bill of lading) must be maintained in the records for a period of three years.
- V. The drinking water supply must be tested annually for bacteriological quality.

5. Notification to the LEA within 24 hours is required for any written complaints received or any complaint called into the facility and any record of receipt of a violation from any regulatory agency.
6. This permit is subject to review by the LEA and may be suspended, revoked or revised at any time for sufficient cause.
7. The LEA reserves the right to suspend or modify waste receiving operations when deemed necessary due to an emergency, a potential health hazard, or the creation of a public nuisance.
8. The maximum permitted daily tonnage for this facility is 5,100 tons per day and shall not receive more than this amount without a revision of this permit.
9. The operator may not change the design or operation of the facility as described in the current permit and JTD without the approval of the EA, as provided in Title 27, Section 21620. Such a change may be considered a significant change, requiring a permit revision. In no case shall the operator implement any change in the design or operation of the facility without first submitting a written notice of the proposed change, in the form of an RFI amendment application, to the EA at least 180 days in advance of the planned implementation of the change.
10. The operator and/or owner shall notify the LEA of any plans to encumber, sell, transfer, or convey the operation or ownership to a new operator or owner, at least 45 days prior to the anticipated transfer, by written certification, including information deemed sufficient by the CalRecycle and the LEA. If the facility will not be operated in compliance with the terms and conditions of this permit, the new owner shall be required to file an application for a revision of this permit.
11. The operator shall immediately report any incidental receipt of untreated medical waste to the California Department of Public Health (CDPH) Medical Waste Management Program at (213) 977-6877 or (213) 977-7379.
12. The operator shall provide training to their personnel to educate them in the identification of medical waste as well as the proper action to take in the event this type of waste is identified at the site.

B. Particular Requirements:

1. Operational controls shall be established to preclude the receipt and disposal of volatile organic chemicals or other types of prohibited wastes:
 - a. The operator shall install and maintain an operational, calibrated radiation detector at the scales to detect radioactive materials, at all times, during the hours of receipt of solid waste.
 - b. Incidents of receipt of suspected radioactive materials, or warnings from the radiation detector, shall be reported immediately to the County of Los Angeles, Department of Public Health, Radiation Management Program at (213) 351-2718 and the LEA.

B. Particular Requirements (continued):

- c. The operator shall comply with the approved Hazardous Waste Screening Program (HWSP) as described in the current JTD. Any changes in this program must be approved by the LEA prior to implementation. The following Solid Waste Facility Permit conditions supplement the HWSP in the JTD:
- (1) A minimum of one (1) loadcheck will be conducted per every 500 tons of municipal solid waste, or portion thereof, received at the facility per operating day. The operator shall inspect all waste vehicle loads if there is any reason to believe the loads may contain prohibited wastes.
 - (2) The LEA may increase the required number of incoming waste load inspections if it has reason to believe that the number currently required is inadequate to ensure compliance with the regulations and protection of the public health and safety and the environment.
 - (3) At all times when facility operations are underway, an attendant or attendants shall be present to supervise the loading and unloading of solid waste and other materials. All working disposal areas shall be under continual visual inspection by facility personnel, such as spotters, equipment operators, and supervisors.
 - (4) Facility personnel and new employees performing duties required by the Hazardous Waste Screening Program shall be trained prior to assignment. The training must include, but is not limited to, how to recognize hazardous waste and other prohibited waste, the proper method of containment, and the reporting requirements of this program. Facility personnel are to be retrained on an annual basis and updated as needed.
 - (5) Incidents of unlawful disposal of prohibited materials shall be reported to the LEA monthly as described in the monitoring section of this permit. In addition, the following agencies shall be notified immediately of any incidents of illegal hazardous materials disposal:
 - (a) Duty officer, Los Angeles County Fire Department, Health Hazardous Materials Division at (323) 890-4317.
 - (b) Environmental Crimes Division, Los Angeles County District Attorney at (213) 580-8777.
 - (c) California Highway Patrol at (800) 835-5247 or (818) 240-8200.
 - (6) Any hazardous materials thus found shall be set aside in a secured area to await proper disposition following notification of the producer (if known) and the appropriate governmental agencies.
2. The LEA reserves the right to require the operator to provide more stringent dust and odor control measures, if the proposed dust and odor control measures identified in the current JTD prove to be inadequate or ineffective.
 3. The use of alternative daily cover (ADC) shall be limited to the materials as described in the current JTD and approved by the LEA.
 4. The operator shall comply with Title 14 California Code of Regulations (14 CCR) Section 17383.3 for Construction & Demolition (C&D) wood debris as identified in the green and wood recovery operation section in the current JTD. The LEA reserves the right to reduce the storage time of these materials if the storage presents a health hazard or becomes public nuisance.

C. Specifications:

1. The daily refuse tonnage of 3,000 includes a maximum of 10 tons per day of sludge material.
2. The Estimated Closure date [specified on Page 1, Section 4 (e) of this permit] is based on 3,000 tons per day or 1,223 tons per day throughput provided in the current JTD.
3. The maximum landfill elevation of 2,400 feet mean sea level (msl) including the final cover as stated in the current JTD.

No Scavenging Allowed!

To protect human health and the environment, State law prohibits the removal, from this facility, of any materials intended for disposal. Materials recovered and recycled in accordance with State issued permits excluded.

Material Definitions

Dirt (clean): Granular soil such as clay, sand or silt that breaks apart when handled by light duty construction equipment such as a small backhoe or skip loader. No trash, metal, excessive rock, concrete, asphalt or wood. Less than 10% root and/or grass contamination. *Loads with these contaminants will be charged as MSW.*

Asphalt/Concrete (clean): Any combination of concrete, asphalt or asphalt grindings which is less than 24 inches (2 feet) in any 2 dimensions. *Loads containing debris exceeding this size limitation will be charged as MSW.* Loads with debris greater than 6 feet in any dimension may be assessed an additional handling fee (hard to handle fee). Concrete debris should have minimal re-bar, or metal protruding from the individual pieces of concrete. No trash, excessive metal, wood, roots or grass contaminants. *Loads with these contaminants will be charged as MSW. Loads with soil content greater than 10% will be charged as MSW.*

Woodwaste and Greenwaste (clean): Any combination of clean wood (no painted or treated wood), tree trimmings and other plant matter not listed below. Minimal roots and soil content allowed. No trash, Yucca trees/bushes, Joshua trees, Palm trees, palm fronds, Rosemary, Tumbleweeds, Bamboo, Sage, Grass, Pine needles, Leaves, Sod, Hay, Oleander, Telephone poles, Railroad ties, Creosote bushes, any kind of treated wood or wood with glue or any kind of adhesive content allowed. *Loads with these contaminants will be charged as MSW.*

Construction and Demolition Waste – C&D: Mixed load consisting of but not limited to: lumber, wood, wood products, roofing materials, plastic pipe, wall board material, rock, concrete, brick, cardboard, etc.

Appliances: Major appliances such as washers, dryers, water heaters, refrigerators are accepted for recycling.

Industrial Waste & Soil Requires Pre-Approval

Industrials wastes, large volume soil jobs, non friable asbestos, treated wood and municipal waste water treatment plant sludge all require pre-approval prior to delivery and acceptance.
